



# Ocean Boat Specifications

**Saltwater Boat Specifications:** All boats except for the Kingfisher require a 2" ball and a 4 prong flat electrical connection. Patrons need to come in a week prior to pick up for correct hitch measurements. **All 4 stroke motors require regular unleaded fuel.**

**22' Norsco with twin 75hp. motors \$249:** Requires a 2" ball 8000# ball with capacity hitch Norsco require a minimum of 7000# towing capacity/ tongue weight of 350 lbs. Norsco carries a total of 102 gallons of fuel and has the capacity to carry 4-6 people.

**24' Kingfisher's with twin 90hp. motors \$299:** Requires a 2 5/16" ball and a 5 prong electrical connection. Kingfisher requires a minimum of 7000# towing capacity tongue weight of 550 lbs. The Kingfishers carry a total of 125 gallons of fuel and has the capacity to carry 4-6 people depending on which one you rent the red one holds six people and the black one holds four people

**22' Aurora's with twin 75hp. motors and 22' Aurora with a 130hp and a 9.9 kicker \$249:** Requires a 2" ball with a 5000# towing capacity. The tongue weight of 200-300 lbs. The Aurora's fuel tanks carry a total of 65 gallons of fuel and have the capacity to carry 4-6 people.

**22' Graylings with twin 50hp. prop's \$159:** The Graylings are allowed to go into fresh water. Specifically for the lower Kenai River for dip netting and for Bay fishing. The towing capacity is 3500 Lbs. with the tongue weight of 150-200 lbs. Fuel capacity 2 – 25 gallon regular unleaded gasoline cans. The maximum weight capacity is 1200 lbs.

## Lake and River Boat Specifications

All boats trailers require a 2" ball and a 4 prong flat electrical (light) connection. A loaded boat weight includes the total weight of fuel, the weight of the motor, the weight of all gear, and the weight of all passengers.

**14' Lund \$45** – Lake Boat with 8hp or 15hp motor holds up to 3 people Tongue weight is 100 pounds maximum weight is 750 pounds with gear. Fuel tank is 20 gallons

**14' Harborcraft \$45** – Lake Boat with 15hp motor holds up to 3 people Tongue weight is 150 pounds maximum weight is 700 with gear. Fuel tank is 15 gallons

**14' Lowe \$45** – Lake Boat with 8hp or 15hp motor. Holds up to three people Tongue weight is 100 pounds maximum weight with gear is 650 pounds Fuel tank is 20 gallons

**14' Crestliner \$45** – Lake Boat with 8hp prop motor. Hold up to three people Tongue weight is 100 pounds max weight with gear is 600 pounds fuel tank is 20 gallons

**16' G3 \$99** – Riverboat with 35hp jet motor with a semi "V" hull, a single 13 gallon regular unleaded gas tank. Tongue weight is 100 lbs. Maximum loaded boat is 600 lbs.

**16' Work Skiff \$80** – Lake Boat with 40hp prop motor. Can hold up to four people maximum weight is 750 pounds with gear

**18' G3 \$119** – Riverboat with a 65hp jet motor. Has a 25 gallon tank. The tongue weight is 100 lbs. with maximum weight of 750 lbs.

**18' Lowe \$119** - Riverboat with a 65hp jet motor, semi "V" hull. Has a 25 gallon gas tank, a tongue weight of 100 lbs. The maximum weight is 750 lbs.

**20' Alumaweld \$129** – Riverboat with 130hp jet motor. It holds 45 gallons of fuel. The tongue weight is 150 lbs. The maximum weight is 1000 lbs.

**18' Hewescraft \$119** – Lake use only with 90hp prop motor. It holds 45 gallons of fuel. The tongue weight is 150 lbs. The maximum weight is 1000 lbs.

**20' Driftboats \$79** – River drift boat good for upper Kenai River floating. Holds up to five people. Maximum weight with gear is 1000 lbs.

## Boat Limits

- **Off Limits:** Eagle River, Ship Creek, Copper River, Matanuska River, Knik River, Chitna River, Talkeetna River, Willow Creek, Yukon River, Tanana River, Ninilchik River, Deep Creek, Kasilof River, and the Cook Inlet. **“No tractor launching”**. JBER boats will not be operated on any of the above rivers/creeks or their tributaries. Customers caught using boats outside of the authorized area will have their rental privileges suspended or revoked.
- Riverboats may not be operated in salt water.
- JBER boats are not allowed outside the state of Alaska.
- Floatation devices must be worn at all times while operating all boats.
- It is customer’s responsibility to check with the Harbor Master and pay all harbor fees.
- Cannot trailer the boat more than 5 miles down any dirt road.
- It is customer’s responsibility to follow the NOAA Weather Channel. If there is a small craft advisory the boat will not leave the harbor.
