JBER Youth Supervision Guidelines

Note: The ages specified are maximum ages and are based on the child's ability to demonstrate age-appropriate behavior and decisions. Children who do not consistently demonstrate age-appropriate behavior should not be given the same degree of self-management responsibilities. In instances below where a "yes" is indicated, the parent is responsible for using reasonable judgement and for any incident or mishap (not considered preventable), which occurs.
